To apply for the exchange, please send the following documents to Ms. Nora Bartels at the Chair of Cultural Economic History:

Sent directly by the lecturer:

- a. for the letter of recommendation name a Heidelberg university lecturer in your application (ONLY required with the application for Yale, SOAS London and Cambridge). MATS students would usually designate their teacher from a seminar or their study focus advisor. The selection committee will then contact the lecturer.

AND all in one pdf-file:

1. letter of motivation, including the reason for choosing the partner university and a ranking of alternative choices and desired duration (1 or 2 semesters), the classes you expect to take abroad and your career goals
2. CV including extracurricular activities
3. university certificates and transcripts of records
4. proof of English proficiency (TOEFL/IELTS) if you did not obtain a B.A. in an English-language program. Yale and Cambridge require a TOEFL iBT minimum of 100 and SOAS a minimum score of 105
5. list your level of knowledge in other languages

All application materials have to be in English

MATS Applicants Requirements

1. All MATS students must **PASS** the Introduction Class to Transcultural Studies
2. ALL MATS students must **COMPLETE 58 ECTS** before leaving Heidelberg for study abroad
3. All MATS students must obtain the **REGULAR MINIMUM OF 28 ECTS** during the study abroad semester
4. Please identify a potential theme and supervisor already in your application for **your M.A. thesis** in the fourth semester and explain your choice

Applicants by OTHER Departments

Statement of your study advisor that your study abroad program will be recognized by your degree program

Frequently asked questions regarding the Study Abroad (FAQ)

Can I also choose a university that is not a listed as a partner above?

Ask at another institute in Heidelberg University that has an Erasmus exchange agreement with your European university of choice. You are free to study at any other university in Europe or overseas upon approval of your academic advisor but please be aware that you may have to pay full tuition fees, unless you can obtain an individual tuition waiver.

Which requirements do I have to meet?

You have to be a student of Heidelberg University and you have to have the necessary language and research skills in order to participate in the exchange.

What happens after I sent in my application?

Usually the applicants are informed by mid-February, whether they have been accepted. Sometimes they are invited to an interview to verify their language and research skills.

Is there an info event that I can participate in?

Yes, there will be one in the Winter semester in the Karl Jaspers Centre.

What is the value of the Erasmus scholarship and what are the criteria by which people are chosen?
